

VOTERS' MEETING REPORT:

15 voters attended. Edith Templeton, Tom Albrecht and Caleb Meyer were received as communicant members through transfer. Steve & Deb Schmidt were transferred to Church of the Lutheran Confession, North Port, FL. Treasurer reported offerings for 2014 were \$ 122,366 which is about \$ 7,600 less than was budgeted. Our \$ 16,000 surplus from 2014 now stands at \$ 7,600. The Audit Committee reported all financial records for 2014 were in good order. Adopted 2015 Budget for the first 7 months: \$ 72,300. Our commitment to the CLC CBP was decreased to \$ 6,000 with our overall support to the CLC/ILC now at \$ 9,520. Elections were held: Three

new councilmen were elected: Mike Brandle, John Gerbitz and Dan Schaefer. Tim Schaser was elected as BOCE member. Voters decided to call the Council/S.S./Mother's room the "Peace Room." Voters decided to allow male confirmands to be eligible to serve as ushers. Our next Quarterly Voters' Meeting is set for April 12th



Scripture Readings:

Psalm 91:1-16

Satan, the old evil foe of anyone who is a Christian, quoted this psalm in his attempt to try and tempt Jesus. So cunning is the serpent that he will even quote the Holy Scriptures themselves in an attempt to snare prey in a spiritual death trap. It is interesting that Satan uses this Psalm because it is packed with comfort and protection for those who trust in the Lord. From this Psalm we have the comfort of

a powerful God, and the reassurance that He will deliver us from every spiritual danger.

He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High Shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. 2 I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust." 3 Surely He shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler And from the perilous pestilence. 4 He shall cover you with His feathers, And under His wings you shall take refuge; His truth shall be your shield and buckler. 5 You shall not be afraid of the terror by night, Nor of the arrow that flies by day, 6 Nor of the pestilence that walks in darkness, Nor of the destruction that lays waste at noonday. 7 A thousand may fall at your side, And ten thousand at your right hand; But it shall not come near you. 8 Only with your eyes shall you look, And see the reward of the wicked. 9 Because you have made the Lord, who is my refuge, Even the Most High, your dwelling place, 10 No evil shall befall you, Nor shall any plague come near your dwelling; 11 For He shall give His angels charge over you, To keep you in all your ways. 12 In their hands they shall bear you up, Lest you dash your foot against a stone. 13 You shall tread upon the lion and the cobra, The young lion and the serpent you shall trample underfoot. 14 "Because he has set his love upon Me, therefore I will deliver him; I will set him on high, because he has known My name. 15 He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him and honor him. 16 With long life I will satisfy him, And show him My salvation."

1 Corinthians 10:1-13

The Apostle Paul warns the congregation at Corinth of some of the dangers facing them. He refreshes their memory of the Jewish background, of the pitfalls some of them fell into. He reassures the congregation that they will not be tempted beyond what they are able to bear, and that with every temptation comes a way of escape also. It is the same for us as well, and God is still faithful to allow only what we are able to bear.

10 Moreover, brethren, I do not want you to be unaware that all our fathers were under the cloud, all passed through the sea, 2 all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, 3 all ate the same spiritual food, 4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them, and that Rock was Christ. 5 But

CLC/WELS/ELS MEETING

REPORT: On Jan. 30, representatives from the Church of the Lutheran Confession (CLC), the Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS), and WELS met for doctrinal discussions at the WELS Center for Mission and Ministry in Waukesha, Wis. This was the first meeting between representatives of these three synods since 1990. It was called by the synod presidents, with the encouragement of the appropriate synod committees, upon the request of a grassroots group of pastors from all three synods in the Mankato, Minn., area.

The meeting was cordial and productive. The participants shared perspectives on the history of the relationship between the three synods. The participants also discussed the "Joint Statement Regarding the Termination of Fellowship Between Church Bodies," a

document that was prepared in 1990 during the last round of doctrinal discussions. A reconciliation is not expected to come about easily or quickly between the CLC and ELS/WELS. But attendees found it was useful to hear first-hand how the situation looks from the perspective of others and to discuss what it would take to overcome the breach that has separated the synods. Representing the CLC were Pres. Michael Eichstadt, Rev. Paul Nolting, and Rev. Bruce Naumann; representing the ELS were Pres. John Moldstad, Prof. Gaylin Schmeling, and Prof. Erling Teigen; and representing WELS were Prof. John Brenner, Prof. Thomas Nass, and Pres. Mark Schroeder. Only one of these participants was involved in the 1990 meetings, so this meeting brought together a new generation of leaders who have not discussed the issues together before.

A second meeting is planned for April 17 in Eau Claire, Wis., to continue the discussions. The second meeting will focus more pointedly on the "Joint Statement" of 1990 and will begin the discussion of additional topics of concern.

As it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play." 8 Nor let us commit sexual immorality, as some of them did, and in one day twenty-three thousand fell; 9 nor let us tempt Christ, as some of them also tempted, and were destroyed by serpents; 10 nor complain, as some of them also complained, and were destroyed by the destroyer. 11 Now all these things happened to them as examples, and they were written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the ages have come. 12 Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall. 13 No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.

Sermon Text: **Matthew 4:1-11**

Theme:

"It is written" shows us...

I: Jesus has power over this world

II: Jesus is the Messiah

III: Jesus is worthy to be praised

4 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. 2 And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry. 3 Now when the tempter came to Him, he said, "If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread." 4 But He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'" 5 Then the devil took Him up into the holy city, set Him on the pinnacle of the temple, 6 and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down. For it is written: 'He shall give His angels charge over you,' and, 'In their hands they shall bear you up, Lest you dash

your foot against a stone.” 7 Jesus said to him, “It is written again, ‘You shall not tempt the Lord your God.’” 8 Again, the devil took Him up on an exceedingly high mountain, and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. 9 And he said to Him, “All these things I will give You if You will fall down and worship me.” 10 Then Jesus said to him, “Away with you, Satan! For it is written, ‘You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only you shall serve.’” 11 Then the devil left Him, and behold, angels came and ministered to Him.
