

Scripture Readings:

Jonah 3:1-5; 10

The Lord, a second time, calls Jonah to take the message of repentance to the people of Nineveh.

Jonah's message touches the hearts of the Ninevites, who are led to repentance by the Spirit and demonstrate it by fasting and wearing sackcloth. God sees that His Word has brought true heart-felt repentance and He does not bring about the threatened destruction of the once wicked city.

Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the second time, saying, 2 "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you." 3 So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, a three-day journey in extent. 4 And Jonah began to enter the city on the first day's walk. Then he cried out and said, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" 5 So the people of Nineveh believed God, proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least of them.

The People of Nineveh Believe

10 Then God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it.

I Corinthians 12:12-21; 26-27

Paul compared the Holy Christian Church to the body of Christ.

As the human body has many parts, each with its own particular function, so the body of Christ has members with various gifts and of different honor. Yet all work together in love and concern for each other and for the good of the whole body.

12 For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. 13
