Paul's Letter to the Romans: Written by the Apostle Paul from Corinth in the spring of 58 A.D. while on his third missionary journey. The church in Rome consisted of both Jewish and Gentile Christians. The Jewish Christians looked upon their descent from Abraham as a badge of honor and the Gentile Christians looked down on the Jews because they so often rejected God's grace. Paul states that there is no difference between Jew and Gentile, neither in regard to their sinful state nor in regard to their justification which is by grace. This blessing of divine grace is granted to all and is received by those who believe, without any distinction of race. "Righteousness" is the theme of this letter—not the righteousness of the Law by works, but the righteousness that Jesus earned for all by His perfect obedient life, His sacrificial death and resurrection. This righteousness is credited to all who believe in Him. Paul's grand conclusion is this: Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, Romans 5:1

Deuteronomy 11:18-21, 26-28

Moses in one of his last encouragements to the people of Israel urges them to plant the Word of God in their hearts and minds, and to teach that same Word to their children as a constant reminder to walk in God's ways. Obedience will bring abundant blessings, while disobedience will result in a curse.

18 "Therefore you shall lay up these words of mine in your heart and in your soul, and bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. 19 You shall teach them to your children, speaking of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. 20 And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, 21 that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land of which the Lord swore to your fathers to give them, like the days of the heavens above the earth.

26 "Behold, I set before you today a blessing and a curse: 27 the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the Lord your God which I command you today; 28 and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the Lord your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you today, to go after other gods which you have not known.

Luke 7:1-10

We enter the non-festival season of the Church Year with this Gospel lesson of a foreigner, a Roman Centurion coming to Jesus for help for his sick servant. The conduct of the Centurion as well as his plea to Christ in this time of need move Jesus to commend the Centurion's faith as being greater than any He has found in Israel. The Lord in mercy and grace heals the Centurion's servant.

Now when He concluded all His sayings in the hearing of the people, He entered Capernaum. 2 And a certain centurion's servant, who was dear to him, was sick and ready to die. 3 So when he heard about Jesus, he sent elders of the Jews to Him, pleading with Him to come and heal his servant. 4 And when they came to Jesus, they begged Him earnestly, saying that the one for whom He should do this was deserving, 5 "for he loves our nation, and has built us a synagogue."

6 Then Jesus went with them. And when He was already not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to Him, saying to Him, "Lord, do not trouble Yourself,

And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." 9 When Jesus heard these things, He marveled at him, and turned around and said to the crowd that followed Him, "I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!" 10 And those who were sent, returning to the house, found the servant well who had been sick.

Sermon Theme:

Every Sinner Declared Righteous!

I: A Declaration coming from God, not man!

II: A Declaration centered in Jesus Christ alone!

III: A Declaration received by Faith, not works!

21 But now the righteousness of God apart from the law is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, 22 even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe. For there is no difference; 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God set forth as a propitiation by His blood, through faith...

27 Where is boasting then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? No, but by the law of faith. 28 Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law.
