



ORDER FOR WORSHIP
Opening Prayer

P: Almighty God, Your blessed Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, ascended

far above all heavens that He might fill all things. Grant us faith to understand that even now, according to His promise, He abides with His Church on earth to the end of the age. In His eternally glorious name we pray. Amen.

Opening Response

P: We open our Ascension service in the name of our Triune God:

C: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Confession of Sins

P: Today we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord, and yet our lives often proclaim our lack of faith in and love for the exalter Christ. Let us confess the sinful inconsistency between our faith and our practice:

C: Almighty God, You raised Jesus from the dead to life and crowned Him Lord of all. We confess that we have not fully bowed before Him or reflected His rule in our lives. We have often followed our own will or drifted along with the ways of the world and failed to glorify Christ. Forgive us and deliver us from our sins, that we may be Your faithful people, obeying Your commands and living under the merciful rule of our Lord and Savior who rules the world and is Head of the Church, His body. Amen.

Forgiveness of Sins (as found in Ephesians 2:4-7)

P: Hear the Good News: God, who is rich in mercy, out of His great love with which He loved us even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved---and raised us up with Him and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. In Christ, by God’s grace, we are saved. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Scripture Reading – The history of our Lord’s Ascension (as compiled from Matthew 28, Luke 24, and Acts 1)

The former account I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach, until the day in which He was taken up, after He through the Holy Spirit had given commandments to the apostles whom He had chosen, to whom He also presented Himself alive after

His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by them during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God. Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted.

And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, “All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age.”

And being assembled together with *them*, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, “which,” *He said*, “you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.”

And He led them out as far as Bethany. Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, “Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?”

And He said to them, “It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”

Now when He had spoken these things, He lifted up His hands and blessed them, and while they watched, He was parted from them and carried up into heaven, and a cloud received Him out of their sight.

And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, who also said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This *same* Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.”

Then they worshiped Him, and returned with great joy to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet (which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day’s journey), and were continually in the temple praising and blessing God. Amen.

You have crowned Him with glory as our King of kings and Lord of lords. Fulfill for us His promise that He would be with us always, even to the end of the world. Fill us with His Spirit to carry out His commission to make disciples of all nations as You have made us His disciples. Even as You have drawn Him to Yourself, so draw us to Him. As He returned to You to prepare a place for us, so take us to Yourself at His coming again. We come to You boldly in prayer, in our Savior’s name and we join in praying the confident prayer He taught us to pray...
