Scripture Readings:

Isaiah 64:1-8

Isaiah pleads to the LORD that He remember that He is the Father of His people Israel, the One who made His covenant of grace with them. In spite of Israel's straying, the prophet asks the LORD to hold back His anger and deal with His unworthy children in mercy. In these words we also see a fearful description of our sinful nature. These words also point us to the only place where help can be found—in the Fatherly mercy of our covenant God.

Oh, that You would rend the heavens! That You would come down! That the mountains might shake at Your presence— 2 As fire burns brushwood, As fire causes water to boil— To make Your name known to Your adversaries, That the nations may tremble at Your presence! 3 When You did awesome things for which we did not look, You came down, The mountains shook at Your presence. 4 For since the beginning of the world Men have not heard nor perceived by the ear, Nor has the eye seen any God besides You, Who acts for the one who waits for Him. 5 You meet him who rejoices and does righteousness, Who remembers You in Your ways. You are indeed angry, for we have sinned— In these ways we continue; And we need to be saved. 6 But we are all like an unclean thing, And all our righteousnesses are like filthy rags; We all fade as a leaf, And our iniquities, like the wind, Have taken us away. 7 And there is no one who calls on Your name, Who stirs himself up to take hold of You; For You have hidden Your face from us, And have consumed us because of our iniquities. 8 But now, O Lord, You are our Father; We are the clay, and You our potter; And all we are the work of Your hand.

I Corinthians 1:3-9

Paul lays before us several strong reminders of the same mercy and grace of God with which the believers in Corinth have been so richly blessed. They (and we) are encouraged to remain steadfast in this grace as we “eagerly wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

I: Be an ALERT Christian, beware of indifference.

II: Be a RESPONSIBLE Christian.

33 Take heed, watch and pray; for you do not know when the time is. 34 It is like a man going to a far country, who left his house and gave authority to his servants, and to each his work, and commanded the doorkeeper to watch. 35 Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house is coming—in the evening, at midnight, at the crowing of the rooster, or in the morning— 36 lest, coming suddenly, he find you sleeping. 37 And what I say to you, I say to all: Watch!"
