

other shades of work-righteousness and be equipped with the truth of the Gospel.

Monday - Galatians 1:1-17 Attack 1 - Paul is a human, we are human, therefore our opinions are as good as his or at least should be tolerated. Defense 1- a. Paul is an apostle not by man but by Jesus Christ! b. No man, not even an angel, can change the Gospel. c. The Gospel is God’s doctrine which He gave to me to give to others.

Tuesday - Galatians 3:1-14 Attack 2 - God gets us started on the road to salvation (faith) but we have to add our works to complete the plan. Defense 2- The Scriptures teach complete salvation through faith in the crucified Christ. a. The case of Abraham. b. The curse of the law rests upon offenders, even one-timers. c. The just shall live by faith (see how many times you can find this same passage repeated in Scripture). d. Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law. Conclusion: Abandon as deadly poison any hope in the works of the law.

Wednesday - Galatians 4:1-11 Attack 3 - Once a believer we have to keep certain laws (especially the ceremonial portions) to remain in the faith. Defense 3- Part I: We are the grown children of God. a. We are children by adoption through the substitutionary work of Jesus. b. The Old Testament Church was a minor child. The New Testament is the child grown up and not under a tutor (Old Testament ceremonial law) Conclusion: The Savior has come. We are grown children, not servants under a law or children under a tutor. Don’t trade this total salvation back again for “no salvation by works.”

Thursday - Galatians 4:21-31 Defense 3- Part II c. The example of Abraham’s two sons: Ishmael, born by the slave woman, Hagar, after the schemes of man. Isaac, born by the free woman, Sarah, after the promise of God. Ishmael = Jerusalem on earth, bondage under the law, salvation by works. Isaac = Jerusalem above, freedom and salvation under the Gospel. From whom are you descended?

Friday - Galatians 5:19-26 The works of the flesh - how many do you count? The fruit of the Spirit - how many? Note the use of the word “fruit”. The Spirit’s work in us produces visible results. Fruits follow faith. John 15:5 “I AM the vine, you are the branches: He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit: for without Me you can do nothing.” Saved by, living in, and walking in the Spirit (No return to the law)

Saturday - Galatians 6:1-11 The law of Christ - love one another. Here this love is manifested by: a. Concern and action for the souls of our fellow Christians. b. Humility. c. Support of the Gospel ministry. d. Helping each other, especially our fellow Christians.

Scripture Readings:

Acts 18:18-23

After spending a year and a half in Corinth, Paul left the city to spread the news of the Savior to other regions. Aquila and Priscilla, whom Paul had met in Corinth, went with him as far as Ephesus and Paul continued on his journey throughout Galatia and Phrygia establishing and strengthening the believers. These are the churches to whom Paul is writing in our epistle today—the Galatians.

18 So Paul still remained a good while. Then he took leave of the brethren and sailed for Syria, and Priscilla and Aquila were with him. He had his hair cut off at Cenchrea, for he had taken a vow. 19 And he came to Ephesus, and left them there; but he himself entered the synagogue and reasoned with the Jews. 20 When they asked him to stay a longer time with them, he did not consent, 21 but took leave of them, saying, "I must by all means keep this coming feast in Jerusalem; but I will return again to you, God willing." And he sailed from Ephesus. 22 And when he had landed at Caesarea, and gone up and greeted the church, he went down to Antioch. 23 After he had spent some time there, he departed and went over the region of Galatia and Phrygia in order, strengthening all the disciples.

Galatians 1:1-12

Paul rebukes the Galatian Christians for allowing themselves to be led astray from the Truth by false teaching that sounded so good. May we not be deceived by the many teachings throughout the world, but instead sink ourselves into the Gospel message of Christ's perfect life, sacrificial death and resurrection for all of mankind.

1 Paul, an apostle (not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father who raised Him from the dead), 2 and all the brethren who are with me, To the churches of Galatia: 3 Grace to you and peace from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, 4 who gave Himself for our sins, that He might deliver us from this present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, 5 to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen. 6 I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, 7 which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ. 8 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed. 9 As we have said before, so now I say again, if anyone preaches any other gospel to you than what you have received, let him be accursed. 10 For do I now persuade men, or God? Or do I seek to please men? For if I still pleased men, I would not be a bondservant of Christ. 11 But I make known to you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. 12 For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through the revelation of Jesus Christ.

THE WITNESS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Sermon Text: Galatians 5:1-13

Theme:

THE LIBERTY OF THE CHRISTIAN

I: Christ has set us FREE from the Law.

II: Combining both Grace and Law destroys the cross.

III: Run in the way of GRACE ALONE.

IV: Remember, FREEDOM does not mean license but LOVE.

5 Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage. 2 Indeed I, Paul, say to you that if you become circumcised, Christ will profit you nothing. 3 And I testify again to every man who becomes circumcised that he is a debtor to keep the whole law. 4 You have become estranged from Christ, you who attempt to be justified by law; you have fallen from grace. 5 For we through the Spirit eagerly wait for the hope of righteousness by faith. 6 For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but faith working through love. 7 You ran well. Who hindered you from obeying the truth? 8 This persuasion does not come from Him who calls you. 9 A little leaven leavens the whole lump. 10 I have confidence in you, in the Lord, that you will have no other mind; but he who troubles you shall bear his judgment, whoever he is. 11 And I, brethren, if I still preach circumcision, why do I still suffer persecution? Then the offense of the cross has ceased. 12 I could wish that those who trouble you would even cut themselves off! 13 For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.
