ABOUT LENTEN WORSHIP

Lenten Worship echoes the traditional 6th century Compline Service. As the last service of the day, Compline petitions God for His peace through the coming night while also trusting His peace for the hour of our death. As part of Lenten Worship congregations will be introduced to the hymn “My Song is Love Unknown,” which was written by Samuel Crossman in 1664. The service is offered in two formats, one leaving the Compline text in spoken form (Setting 1), and the other pairing the liturgical text with original music (Setting 2).

PASSION & SCRIPTURE READINGS

Genesis 3:22-24 Then the LORD God said, “Behold, the
man has become like one of Us, to know good and evil.
And now, lest he put out his hand and take also of the tree
of life, and eat, and live forever” -- 23 therefore the LORD
God sent him out of the garden of Eden to till the ground
from which he was taken. 24 So He drove out the man; and
He placed cherubim at the east of the garden of Eden, and
a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way
to the tree of life.

Revelation 22:1-5 And he showed me a pure river of water
of life, clear as crystal, proceeding from the throne of
God and of the Lamb. 2 In the middle of its street, and
on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore

twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. ³ And there shall be no more curse, but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it, and His servants shall serve Him. ⁴ They shall see His face, and His name shall be on their foreheads. ⁵ There shall be no night there: They need no lamp nor light of the sun, for the Lord God gives them light. And they shall reign forever and ever.

Luke 13:10-17 Now He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. ¹¹ And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. ¹² But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, “Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity.” ¹³ And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. ¹⁴ But the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath; and he said to the crowd, “There are six days on which men ought to work; therefore come and be healed on them, and not on the Sabbath day.” ¹⁵ The Lord then answered him and said, “Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from the stall, and lead it away to water it? ¹⁶ “So ought not this

woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound -- think of it -- for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?” ¹⁷ And when He said these things, all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him.


