ABOUT LENTEN WORSHIP

Lenten Worship echoes the traditional 6th century Compline Service. As the last service of the day, Compline petitions God for His peace through the coming night while also trusting His peace for the hour of our death. As part of Lenten Worship congregations will be introduced to the hymn “My Song is Love Unknown,” which was written by Samuel Crossman in 1664. The service is offered in two formats, one leaving the Compline text in spoken form (Setting 1), and the other pairing the liturgical text with original music (Setting 2).


PRE-SERVICE DEVOTION

PASSION & SCRIPTURE READINGS

Joshua 3:1-6 Then Joshua rose early in the morning;
and they set out from Acacia Grove and came to the
Jordan, he and all the children of Israel, and lodged there
before they crossed over. 2 So it was, after three days,
that the officers went through the camp; 3 and they
commanded the people, saying, “When you see the ark

of the covenant of the LORD your God, and the priests, the Levites, bearing it, then you shall set out from your place and go after it. 4 “Yet there shall be a space between you and it, about two thousand cubits by measure. Do not come near it, that you may know the way by which you must go, for you have not passed this way before.” 5 And Joshua said to the people, “Sanctify yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do wonders among you.” 6 Then Joshua spoke to the priests, saying, “Take up the ark of the covenant and cross over before the people.” So they took up the ark of the covenant and went before the people.

Philippians 3:12-21 Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. 13 Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, 14 I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. 15 Therefore let us, as many as are mature, have this mind; and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal even this to you. 16 Nevertheless, to the degree that we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let

us be of the same mind. 17 Brethren, join in following my example, and note those who so walk, as you have us for a pattern. 18 For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, that they are the enemies of the cross of Christ: 19 whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame -- who set their mind on earthly things. 20 For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, 21 who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.

Matthew 3:13; 4:1,2 Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him . . . 1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. 2 And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry.
