Scripture Readings:

Hosea 1:1-2:1 Hosea is called by God to prophesy during Israel's last hours. Hosea's personal tragedy becomes an intense illustration of Israel's national tragedy. It is a lesson of one-sided love and faithfulness between a prophet and his faithless wife (Hosea & Gomer) and between Jehovah and His faithless people (Israel). Just as Gomer is married to Hosea, Israel is betrothed to the LORD Jehovah. In both cases the bride is unfaithful and runs after other lovers. But unconditional love keeps seeking even when it is spurned. In Hosea's case, that means buying his wife back from the slave market. For Israel it means physical punishment now, but for spiritual Israel a redemption and deliverance through Christ.
1 The word of the LORD that came to Hosea the son of Beeri, in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel. 2 When the LORD began to speak by Hosea, the LORD said to Hosea: " Go, take yourself a wife of harlotry And children of harlotry, For the land has committed great harlotry By departing

from the LORD.” 3 So he went and took Gomer the daughter of Diblaim, and she conceived and bore him a son. 4 Then the LORD said to him: “ Call his name Jezreel, For in a little while I will avenge the bloodshed of Jezreel on the house of Jehu, And bring an end to the kingdom of the house of Israel. 5 It shall come to pass in that day That I will break the bow of Israel in the Valley of Jezreel.” 6 And she conceived again and bore a daughter. Then God said to him: “ Call her name Lo-Ruhamah, For I will no longer have mercy on the house of Israel, But I will utterly take them away. 7 Yet I will have mercy on the house of Judah, Will save them by the LORD their God, And will not save them by bow, Nor by sword or battle, By horses or horsemen.” 8 Now when she had weaned Lo-Ruhamah, she conceived and bore a son. 9 Then God said: “ Call his name Lo-Ammi, For you are not My people, And I will not be your God. 10 “ Yet the number of the children of Israel Shall be as the sand of the sea, Which cannot be measured or numbered. And it shall come to pass In the place where it was said to them, ‘ You are not My people,’ There it shall be said to them, ‘ You are sons of the living God.’ 11 Then the children of Judah and the children of Israel Shall be gathered together, And appoint for themselves one head; And they shall come up out of the land, For great will be the day of Jezreel! Hosea 2 1 Say to your brethren, ‘My people,’ And to your sisters, ‘Mercy is shown.’

Luke 15:11-32 We see the Father’s love for lost sinners. He abides faithful even though we have been faithless. May we, from the heart, say the same as the Prodigal Son, “I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, ‘Father I have sinned against heaven and before you.’” Then see the bondless love, the open arms, the forgiving welcome. “To-day, Thy mercy calls us to wash away our sin. However great our trespass, whatever we have been. However long from mercy our hearts have turned away, Thy precious blood can cleanse us and make us white today.” Thank the Lord!

11 Then He said: “A certain man had two sons. 12 And the younger of them said to his father, ‘Father, give me the portion of goods that falls to me.’ So he divided to them his livelihood. 13 And not many days after, the younger son gathered all together, journeyed to a far country, and there wasted his possessions with prodigal living. 14 But when he had spent all, there arose a severe famine in that land, and he began to be in want. 15 Then he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country, and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. 16 And he would gladly have filled his stomach with the pods that the swine ate, and no one gave him anything. 17 “But when he came to himself, he said, ‘How many of my father’s hired servants have bread enough and to

CLC Board of Missions

Holy Cross in Phoenix has called its assistant pastor, Michael Gurath, to serve as a missionary in East Africa for a period of six to thirteen months.

As agreed to with the CLC Board of Missions, Michael Gurath would be going as part of the Mission Helper Program. His base of operation is to be Moi's Bridge, Kenya. Nearby is a village, Emmaus Milimani, where a group of people desires to establish a church and school affiliated with the CLC, and Pastor Gurath is to help in this effort. (Currently 100+ adults assemble for worship on Sundays. They listen to worship services from Holy Cross. 150 children attend Sunday School.)

He will also be available to travel to and serve at other CLC affiliated congregations and schools in East Africa as well. The overall funding for the trip, especially for the work in Emmaus Milimani, will be provided by Holy Cross. The expense of travel to other locales will be covered by the MDF. Pastor Michael Gurath has accepted this call.

And they began to be merry. 25 "Now his older son was in the field. And as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. 26 So he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. 27 And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and because he has received him safe and sound, your father has killed the fatted calf.' 28 "But he was angry and would not go in. Therefore his father came out and pleaded with him. 29 So he answered and said to his father, 'Lo, these many years I have been serving you; I never transgressed your commandment at any time; and yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might make merry with my friends. 30 But as soon as this son of yours came, who has devoured your livelihood with harlots, you killed the fatted calf for him.' 31 "And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that I have is yours. 32 It was right that we should make merry and be glad, for your brother was dead and is alive again, and was lost and is found.'"
