FULL-TIME POSITION OPENING AT IMMANUEL LUTHERAN COLLEGE

The position of FACILITIES MANAGER has opened in the maintenance department of ILC. This is a full-time position with full compensation (salary, medical insurance [ILC group], retirement). The following is a general description of the position.

Responsibilities:

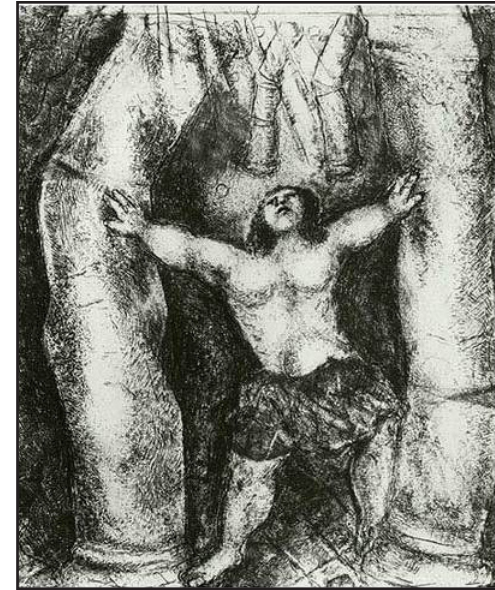
& Overseeing and executing the maintenance of the physical infrastructure of ILC. Maintaining a physical environment which is beneficial to the welfare of our students, conducive to learning, and a reflection of our gratitude to the Lord for His saving love. Repair, maintenance, and improvements of the infrastructure of the ILC campus. Grounds: mowing, tree trimming, snow plowing, road repair, etc. Buildings: equipment maintenance, plumbing,

electrical, furnace and boiler care, building improvements, furniture repair, etc. This includes long-term planning, hiring and oversight of contractors, serving as purchasing agent for materials that pertain to the infrastructure of the campus, and a willingness to be on-call after hours. Supervision of the maintenance staff, student cleaners, and pertinent volunteer workers. Supervisor: This position reports to the ILC President. Comportment: It is expected of our staff that they conduct themselves according to the standards set forth in the Holy Scriptures. Compensation: The compensation package will be made available to those who apply. Application: Application forms will be available through your pastor or on the ILC website

2 Timothy 1:3-14

3 I thank God, whom I serve with a pure conscience, as my forefathers did, as without ceasing I remember you in my prayers night and day, 4 greatly desiring to see you, being mindful of your tears, that I may be filled with joy, 5 when I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also. 6 Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands. 7 For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind. 8 Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord, nor of me His prisoner, but share with me in the sufferings for the gospel according to the power of God, 9 who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to us in Christ Jesus before time began, 10 but has now been revealed by the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel, 11 to which I was appointed a preacher, an apostle, and a teacher of the Gentiles. 12 For this reason I also suffer these things; nevertheless I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him until that Day. 13 Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus. 14 That good thing which was committed to you, keep by the Holy Spirit who dwells in us.

Sermon Text:

Luke 17:1-10

Humility Is A Key Component Of Discipleship

I: It leads to a concern for the spiritual welfare of others.

II: It recognizes the need for a greater faith.

III: It distinguishes between duty and grace.

1 Then He said to the disciples, "It is impossible that no offenses should come, but woe to him through whom they do come! 2 It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were thrown into the sea, than that he should offend one of these little ones. 3 Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him. 4 And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times in a day returns to you, saying, 'I repent,' you shall forgive him." 5 And the apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." 6 So the Lord said, "If you have faith as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'Be pulled up by the roots and be planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. 7 And which of you, having a servant plowing or tending sheep, will say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come at once and sit down to eat'? 8 But will he not rather say to him, 'Prepare something for my supper, and gird yourself and serve me till I have eaten and drunk, and afterward you will eat and drink'? 9 Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I think not. 10 So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do.'"
