

NOTES ON JOHN: The writer of the Gospel of John was the Apostle John, brother of James, the son of Zebedee. John refers to himself throughout the entire book as “the disciple whom Jesus loved.” The Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke share many common lessons and accounts and are therefore grouped together as the Synoptic Gospels. John, on the other hand, contains many accounts that are unique to his book so it stands alone as the fourth Gospel. According to church tradition, John is believed to have continued his ministry in Ephesus, where he eventually wrote I, II, and III John. After serving in Ephesus he was most likely exiled to the island of Patmos where he received a revelation from Christ.



One could say that the Holy Spirit inspired John to focus his Gospel account around the verb *believe*. This concept is associated with the atoning word of Jesus and is brought out in many passages such as: 1:12, 3:16, 3:36, 5:24-29, 10:27-29, and 11:25-27. Our sermon text today is taken from a section of private instruction during holy week between Jesus and His twelve disciples.

Scripture Readings:

Hosea 14:1-9

Throughout the entire book of Hosea, the divided kingdoms of Israel and Judah have been examples of unfaithfulness to the LORD. Hosea uses several illustrations to depict this type of attitude: A wayward wife, illegitimate children, wild grapes, and a stubborn young calf. Although Israel

and Judah have once again turned from the LORD to themselves and foreign idols, the LORD's mercy is not extinguished. Chapter 14 describes the relief that they had in the LORD, the same comfort that we have today.

1 O Israel, return to the LORD your God, For you have stumbled because of your iniquity; 2 Take words with you, And return to the LORD. Say to Him, "Take away all iniquity; Receive us graciously, For we will offer the sacrifices of our lips. 3 Assyria shall not save us, We will not ride on horses, Nor will we say anymore to the work of our hands, 'You are our gods.' For in You the fatherless finds mercy." 4 "I will heal their backsliding, I will love them freely, For My anger has turned away from him. 5 I will be like the dew to Israel; He shall grow like the lily, And lengthen his roots like Lebanon. 6 His branches shall spread; His beauty shall be like an olive tree, And his fragrance like Lebanon. 7 Those who dwell under his shadow shall return; They shall be revived like grain, And grow like a vine. Their scents shall be like the wine of Lebanon. 8 "Ephraim shall say, 'What have I to do anymore with idols?' I have heard and observed him. I am like a green cypress tree; Your fruit is found in Me." 9 Who is wise? Let him understand these things. Who is prudent? Let him know them. For the ways of the LORD are right; The righteous walk in them, But transgressors stumble in them.

Galatians 5: 16-26

The Apostle Paul uses two contrasting lists of works to show the Galatian Christians just how futile it is to justify oneself by the law. When we rely on our own flesh for works we get nothing but sin-stained results (vv. 19-21). But when we rely on Christ's merits as our works, we actually crucify our sinful flesh and receive the fruit of the Spirit (vv.22-23). Thanks be to God that because of Christ's work we are able to serve one another.

16 I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh. 17 For the flesh lusts against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; and these are contrary to one another, so that you do not do the things that you wish. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. 19 Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, 20 idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, 21 envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law. 24 And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. 25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. 26 Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another.

Sermon Text: **John 15:1-8** **GO GREEN IN CHRIST**

I. ABIDE IN HIM

II. BEAR FRUIT IN HIM

1 "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. 2 Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit. 3 You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you. 4 Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. 5 "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. 6 If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered; and they gather them and throw them into the fire, and they are burned. 7 If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. 8 By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples.
