HOME DEVOTIONS - Week #12



Monday - Colossians 2:6-15 It has happened that a believer has given up the simple truths of God's Word for worldly wisdom. All the philosophy of unregenerate man is pompous vanity and deception. The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, knowing that Jesus has nailed the charges against us to the cross. May we never walk away from Jesus and stray into the philosophical quicksand of sinful man.

Tuesday - Colossians 2:16-23 We are again to the basic definition of Christianity. We know that Christ is not a new law-giver, but rather has rescued us from the judgment upon us for transgressing God's code of conduct. Don't shift your faith from the works of Christ done for you (Gospel) to your works to be done for God(law}.

Wednesday - Colossians 3:1-11 Note the contrast (and warfare) between the old man (flesh, old Adam) and the new man. Old - immersed in the cares of this world - delighting in all manner of sin - earning the judgment of God. New - set on things above - renewed in the knowledge of God - life in Christ now. The ultimate put-off of the old man is death. Then we shall appear with Christ in glory and everlasting life.

Thursday - Colossians 3:12-17 The 8 qualities listed in v.12-14 are a reflection of the image of God in which the new man is renewed (v. 10). We are to be "chips off the old block", children who reflect their Father in heaven. How could we, still shackled with the old man, ever do this? Impossible - were it not for the sanctifying Word of Christ which fills our lives. (v.16)

Friday - Colossians 3:18 - 4:1 Here consider our station (position) in life, whether you are . . . Why not let each read his appropriate Word from God. For the servant (v.22-25) and master (4:1) section, think of terms of employee - employer. How does the counsel of God contrast with the opinions of men?

Saturday - Colossians 4:2-6 Here the station of just being a Christian is covered. Prayer, watchfulness, special prayers for the Gospel ministry and testimony to unbelievers. See how this testimony may be by word (v.6) or by our actions (v. 5). "Actions speak louder than words." What have you been saying to the people? Pray for grace that you may speak and act Christlike.

- The CLC Board of Missions has called Pastor Peter Evensen, pastor of Rock of Ages Lutheran, Grand Rapids MI, to be a Resident CLC Foreign Missionary to India.

IMMANUEL BEGINS:

This past Monday the academic year began at Immanuel Lutheran in Eau Claire, WI. During the opening service, President Sippert reminded the student body of our Savior's growth plan through the Word of God. High school enrollment begins with 111 total students (24 freshmen, 25 sophomores, 29 juniors, and 33 seniors). This is a drop of 13 students from last year, mostly because the incoming freshman class is a little smaller than last year's graduating class. In the college there are 23 total students, a nice increase from last year's enrollment of 15. At this time six of these students

are pursuing the teaching ministry and ten are preparing for seminary training. While seminary will begin later, six students are expected for the year. Word of God---One God; Trinity; One created human race: sinful; One call: to repentance and faith; One Savior: who died and rose for all.

15 So those who conducted Paul brought him to Athens; and receiving a command for Silas and Timothy to come to him with all speed, they departed. 16 Now while Paul waited for them at Athens, his spirit was provoked within him when he saw that the city was given over to idols. 17 Therefore he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and with the Gentile worshipers, and in the marketplace daily with those who happened to be there. 18 Then certain Epicurean and Stoic philosophers encountered him. And some said, "What does this babbler want to say?" Others said, "He seems to be a proclaimer of foreign gods," because he preached to them Jesus and the resurrection. 19 And they took him and brought him to the Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new doctrine is of which you speak? 20 For you are bringing some strange things to our ears. Therefore we want to know what these things mean." 21 For all the Athenians and the foreigners who were there spent their time in nothing else but either to tell or to hear some new thing. 22 Then Paul stood in the midst of the Areopagus and said, "Men of Athens, I perceive that in all things you are very religious; 23 for as I was passing through and considering the objects of your worship, I even found an altar with this inscription:

TO THE UNKNOWN GOD.

Therefore, the One whom you worship without knowing, Him I proclaim to you: 24 "God, who made the world and everything in it, since He is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands. 25 Nor is He worshiped with men's hands, as though He needed anything, since He gives to all life, breath, and all things. 26 And He has made from one blood every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, and has determined their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings, 27 so that they should seek the Lord, in the hope that they might grope for Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us; 28 for in Him we live and move and have our being, as also some of your own poets have said, 'For we are also His offspring.' 29 Therefore, since we are the offspring of God, we ought not to think that the Divine Nature is like gold or silver or stone, something shaped by art and man's devising. 30 Truly, these times of ignorance

God overlooked, but now commands all men everywhere to repent, 31 because He has appointed a day on which He will judge the world in righteousness by the Man whom He has ordained. He has given assurance of this to all by raising Him from the dead.” 32 And when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked, while others said, “We will hear you again on this matter.” 33 So Paul departed from among them. 34 However, some men joined him and believed, among them Dionysius the Areopagite, a woman named Damaris, and others with them.

that in Him all the fullness should dwell, 20 and by Him to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross. 21 And you, who once were alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now He has reconciled 22 in the body of His flesh through death, to present you holy, and blameless, and above reproach in His sight— 23 if indeed you continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and are not moved away from the hope of the gospel which you heard, which was preached to every creature under heaven, of which I, Paul, became a minister.

Theme:

THE SUPREMACY AND UNIQUE GREATNESS OF JESUS CHRIST

I: He is TRUE God, with the Father from ETERNITY.
