and may be ordered directly through Pastor Seybt via email at cmseybster@yahoo.com.



Scripture Readings:

Isaiah 61:1-3

These words of Isaiah are the words of the Servant of the LORD. Jesus gave His own commentary on these words in Luke 4 and showed that these words were a prophesy about Him. In fact, He is the Speaker. He is the Suffering servant of the Lord. Even as Christ is the center of this text, He is the center of the Christmas season. He comes to bring the greatest news from God and He comes to fill the greatest need of mankind.

"The Spirit of the Lord God is upon Me, Because the Lord has anointed Me To preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to the captives, And the opening of the prison to those who are bound; 2 To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, And the day of vengeance of our God; To comfort all who mourn, 3 To console those who mourn in Zion, To give them beauty for ashes, The oil of joy for mourning, The garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; That they may be called trees of righteousness, The planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified."

I Thessalonians 5:16-24

As we live in preparation for Christ's return, the Lord through Paul encourages us to rejoice, pray and to give thanks always and in everything. He admonishes us to grow in the Spirit and His Word, testing everything and holding only to that which is good. The motive and power to live in this way till Jesus returns is God's Gospel of peace that sanctifies us and keeps us.

16 Rejoice always, 17 pray without ceasing, 18 in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. 19 Do not quench the Spirit. 20 Do not despise prophecies. 21 Test all things; hold fast what is good. 22 Abstain from every form of evil. 23 Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. 24 He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it.

A VOICE STILL CRIES IN THE WILDERNESS

I: A Faithful Voice.

II: A Humble Voice.

II: A Voice with a Mission.

6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7 This man came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all through him might believe. 8 He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light.

19 Now this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" 20 He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." 21 And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." 22 Then they said to him, "Who are you, that we may give an answer to those who sent us? What do you say about yourself?" 23 He said: "I am 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Make straight the way of the Lord,"' as the prophet Isaiah said." 24 Now those who were sent were from the Pharisees. 25 And they asked him, saying, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" 26 John answered them, saying, "I baptize with water, but there stands One among you whom you do not know. 27 It is He who, coming after me, is preferred before me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose." 28 These things were done in Bethabara beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
