Scripture Readings:

2 Corinthians 3:7-18

Paul speaks of Moses, who appeared with Elijah and Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration. The Law came through Moses in a glorious way, but even more glorious is the Gospel which proclaims the way of salvation as free grace, given through the redeeming work of Jesus. This glory of the Gospel never ends.

7 But if the ministry of death, written and engraved on stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not look steadily at the face of Moses

because of the glory of his countenance, which glory was passing away, 8 how will the ministry of the Spirit not be more glorious? 9 For if the ministry of condemnation had glory, the ministry of righteousness exceeds much more in glory. 10 For even what was made glorious had no glory in this respect, because of the glory that excels. 11 For if what is passing away was glorious, what remains is much more glorious. 12 Therefore, since we have such hope, we use great boldness of speech— 13 unlike Moses, who put a veil over his face so that the children of Israel could not look steadily at the end of what was passing away. 14 But their minds were blinded. For until this day the same veil remains unlifted in the reading of the Old Testament, because the veil is taken away in Christ. 15 But even to this day, when Moses is read, a veil lies on their heart. 16 Nevertheless when one turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. 17 Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. 18 But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.

Mark 9:2-10

The Appearance of Moses and Elijah with Jesus in glorified bodies provided Peter, James, and John with a foretaste of heaven. This event also strengthened them in their faith in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. Peter longed to keep this heavenly experience on earth, but it will not belong to anyone fully until the day of the resurrection of all the dead.

2 Now after six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John, and led them up on a high mountain apart by themselves; and He was transfigured before them. 3 His clothes became shining, exceedingly white, like snow, such as no launderer on earth can whiten them. 4 And Elijah appeared to them with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. 5 Then Peter answered and said to Jesus, “Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; and let us make three tabernacles: one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah”— 6 because he did not know what to say, for they were greatly afraid. 7 And a cloud came and overshadowed them; and a voice came out of the cloud, saying, “This is My beloved Son. Hear Him!” 8 Suddenly, when they had looked around, they saw no one anymore, but only Jesus with themselves. 9 Now as they came down from the mountain, He commanded them that they should tell no one the things they had seen, till the Son of Man had risen from the dead. 10 So they kept this word to themselves, questioning what the rising from the dead meant.

Sermon Text: **2 Kings 2:1-12**

Sermon Theme:

THE GLORY OF A BELIEVER'S LIFE!

I: It Is Glorious When It Is Spent Serving The Lord.

Ii: It Is Glorious When It Ends In Eternal Life In Heaven.

2 And it came to pass, when the Lord was about to take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal. 2 Then Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here, please, for the Lord has sent me on to Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the Lord lives, and as your soul lives, I will not leave you!" So they went down to Bethel. 3 Now the sons of the prophets who were at Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, "Do you know that the Lord will take away your master from over you today?" And he said, "Yes, I know; keep silent!" 4 Then Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here, please, for the Lord has sent me on to Jericho." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as your soul lives, I will not leave you!" So they came to Jericho. 5 Now the sons of the prophets who were at Jericho came to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know that the Lord will take away your master from over you today?" So he answered, "Yes, I know; keep silent!" 6 Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here, please, for the Lord has sent me on to the Jordan." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as your soul lives, I will not leave you!" So the two of them went on. 7 And fifty men of the sons of the prophets went and stood facing them at a distance, while the two of them stood by the Jordan. 8 Now Elijah took his mantle, rolled it up, and struck the water; and it was divided this way and that, so that the two of them crossed over on dry ground. 9 And so it was, when they had crossed over, that Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask! What may I do for you, before I am taken away from you?" Elisha said, "Please let a double portion of your spirit be upon me." 10 So he said, "You have asked a hard thing. Nevertheless, if you see me when I am taken from you, it shall be so for you; but if not, it shall not be so." 11 Then it happened, as they continued on and talked, that suddenly a chariot of fire appeared with horses of fire, and separated the two of them; and Elijah went

up by a whirlwind into heaven. 12 And Elisha saw it, and he cried out, "My father, my father, the chariot of Israel and its horsemen!" So he saw him no more. And he took hold of his own clothes and tore them into two pieces.

VOTERS' MEETING REPORT: 16 voters attended. Karl Gullerud and daughter Julia were transferred to Messiah Lutheran Church, Eau Claire, WI. Tom Albrecht and Luke Schaser were received as Voting members. Peter Bank will be attending Peace Thru Christ Lutheran School as a 5th grader. Treasurer reported offerings for 2015 were \$120,319 which is \$2,681 less than was budgeted. We have a surplus at the end of 2015 of \$7,930. Praise the Lord for His gifts of grace! Adopted 2016 Budget of: \$126,744. That is an average of \$2,440 per week. Our commitment to the CLC

CBP was increased to \$6,500 with our overall support to the CLC/ILC funds now at \$10,270. Elections were held: Three new councilmen were elected: Joel Albrecht, Caleb Meyer, and Tim Schaser. Matt Schaser was elected as BOCE member. A "Thank Offering" gift of \$750 will be given to the CLC CBP. Pastor's housing allowance was again set at \$18,000. Our next Quarterly Voters' Meeting is set for April 24th
