

PRAY FOR LIFE: This Wednesday, Jan. 22nd is the 41st anniversary of the ungodly Roe vs. Wade decision that legalized abortion through all 9 months of pregnancy throughout the United States. On that day, Jan. 22, 1973 abortion became the national response to the problem of unwanted human life. Seven men in black robes turned their backs on God, on women, on families in need and on unborn babies. Since that time over 57 million babies have been "legally" killed in their mother's womb—the place that should be the safest. What a horrible tragedy and what an abomination before God who creates life and who sent His Son to redeem our lives! We need to continue to pray, to speak out against this "legalized murder" and to work through legal means to restore the rights of the unborn. "Speak out for those who cannot speak. For the rights of those who are appointed to die." Proverbs 31:8. We need to teach and preach to our children and our children's children that God creates life and therefore we must act to PRESERVE LIFE, not destroy it.

For You formed my inward parts; You covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; marvelous are Your works, and that that my soul knows very well. My frame was not hidden from You, when I was made in secret, and skillfully wrought in the lowest parts of the earth. Your eyes saw my substance, being yet unformed. Matthew 5:1-12 The introduction to the Sermon on the Mount was spoken to those who already knew Jesus as their Savior. Jesus is inviting His people to follow Him in humble, child-like faith which makes itself evident in both attitude and actions.

5 And seeing the multitudes, He went up on a mountain, and when He was seated His disciples came to Him. 2 Then He opened His mouth and taught them, saying: 3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit, For theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 4 Blessed are those who mourn, For they shall be comforted. 5 Blessed are the meek, For they shall inherit the earth. 6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, For they shall be filled. 7 Blessed are the merciful, For they shall obtain mercy. 8 Blessed are the pure in heart, For they shall see God. 9 Blessed are the peacemakers, For they shall be called

sons of God. 10 Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, For theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 11 "Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. 12 Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.
