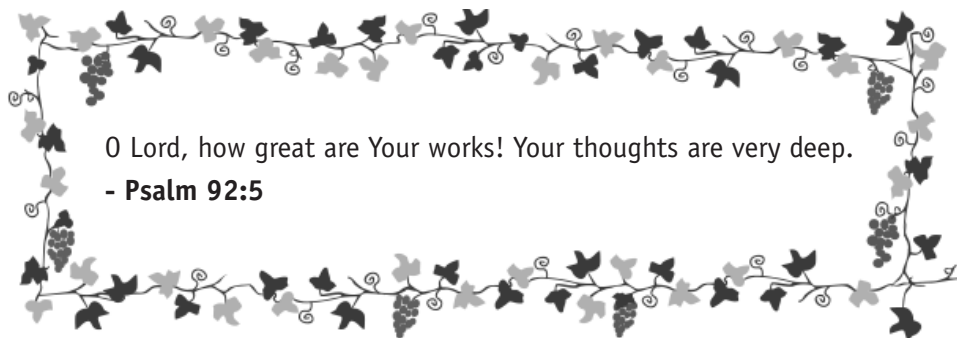
VICAR:

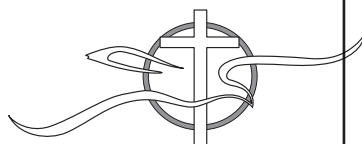

EVANGELISM MEETING:

Today around 10:15 a.m.

God is both painful and perplexing to him because of the many and great blessings and privileges the Jewish people have received from their loving and gracious God. However, all Israel will still be saved. That is, all who believe in Jesus as their Lord and Savior, for “they are not all Israel who are of Israel.” In other words, just because one was born of the seed of Abraham, that did not make one a child of God. The ones who believe the promise of the Messiah, the Savior Jesus, are called the children of promise and are counted as the real seed of Abraham—the children of God.

9 I tell the truth in Christ, I am not lying, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Spirit, 2 that I have great sorrow and continual grief in my heart. 3 For I could wish that I myself were accursed from Christ for my brethren, my countrymen according to the flesh, 4 who are Israelites, to whom pertain the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the service of God, and the promises; 5 of whom are the fathers and from whom, according to the flesh, Christ came, who is over all, the eternally blessed God. Amen. 6 But it is not that the word of God has taken no effect. For they are not all Israel who are of Israel, 7 nor are they all children because they are the seed of Abraham; but, “In Isaac your seed shall be called.” 8 That is, those who are the children of the flesh, these are not the children of God; but the children of the promise are counted as the seed.
