

Scripture Readings:

Isaiah 52:1-6

Isaiah urges Zion—the people of God—to “awake, clothe yourself with strength” so that as those who are redeemed without money (saved by grace in Christ) they might know the LORD and be ready when He comes.

52 Awake, awake! Put on your strength, O Zion; Put on your beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city! For the uncircumcised and the unclean Shall no longer come to you. 2 Shake yourself from the dust, arise; Sit down, O Jerusalem! Loose yourself from the bonds of your neck,

O captive daughter of Zion! 3 For thus says the Lord: "You have sold yourselves for nothing, And you shall be redeemed without money." 4 For thus says the Lord God: "My people went down at first Into Egypt to dwell there; Then the Assyrian oppressed them without cause. 5 Now therefore, what have I here," says the Lord, "That My people are taken away for nothing? Those who rule over them Make them wail," says the Lord, "And My name is blasphemed continually every day. 6 Therefore My people shall know My name; Therefore they shall know in that day That I am He who speaks: 'Behold, it is I.'"

I Corinthians 15:54-58

Paul writes about Christ's victory over sin and death. This victory through our Lord Jesus Christ will move us to give ourselves "fully to the work of the Lord."

54 So when this corruptible has put on incorruption, and this mortal has put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." 55 "O Death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory?" 56 The sting of death is sin, and the strength of sin is the law. 57 But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. 58 Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.

over ten cities.' 18 And the second came, saying, 'Master, your mina has earned
five minas.' 19 Likewise he said to him, 'You also be over five cities.' 20 "Then
another came, saying, 'Master, here is your mina, which I have kept put away
in a handkerchief. 21 For I feared you, because you are an austere man. You
collect what you did not deposit, and reap what you did not sow.' 22 And he
said to him, 'Out of your own mouth I will judge you, you wicked servant. You
knew that I was an austere man, collecting what I did not deposit and reaping
what I did not sow. 23 Why then did you not put my money in the bank, that
at my coming I might have collected it with interest?' 24 "And he said to those
who stood by, 'Take the mina from him, and give it to him who has ten minas.'
25 (But they said to him, 'Master, he has ten minas.') 26 'For I say to you,
that to everyone who has will be given; and from him who does not have, even
what he has will be taken away from him. 27 But bring here those enemies of
mine, who did not want me to reign over them, and slay them before me.'"
