

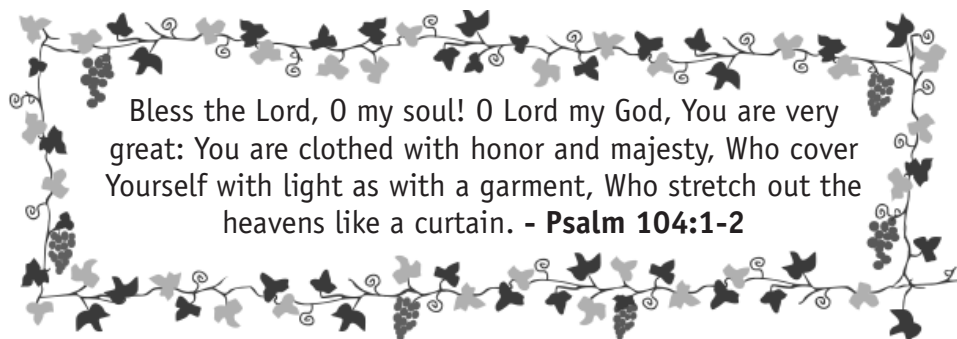

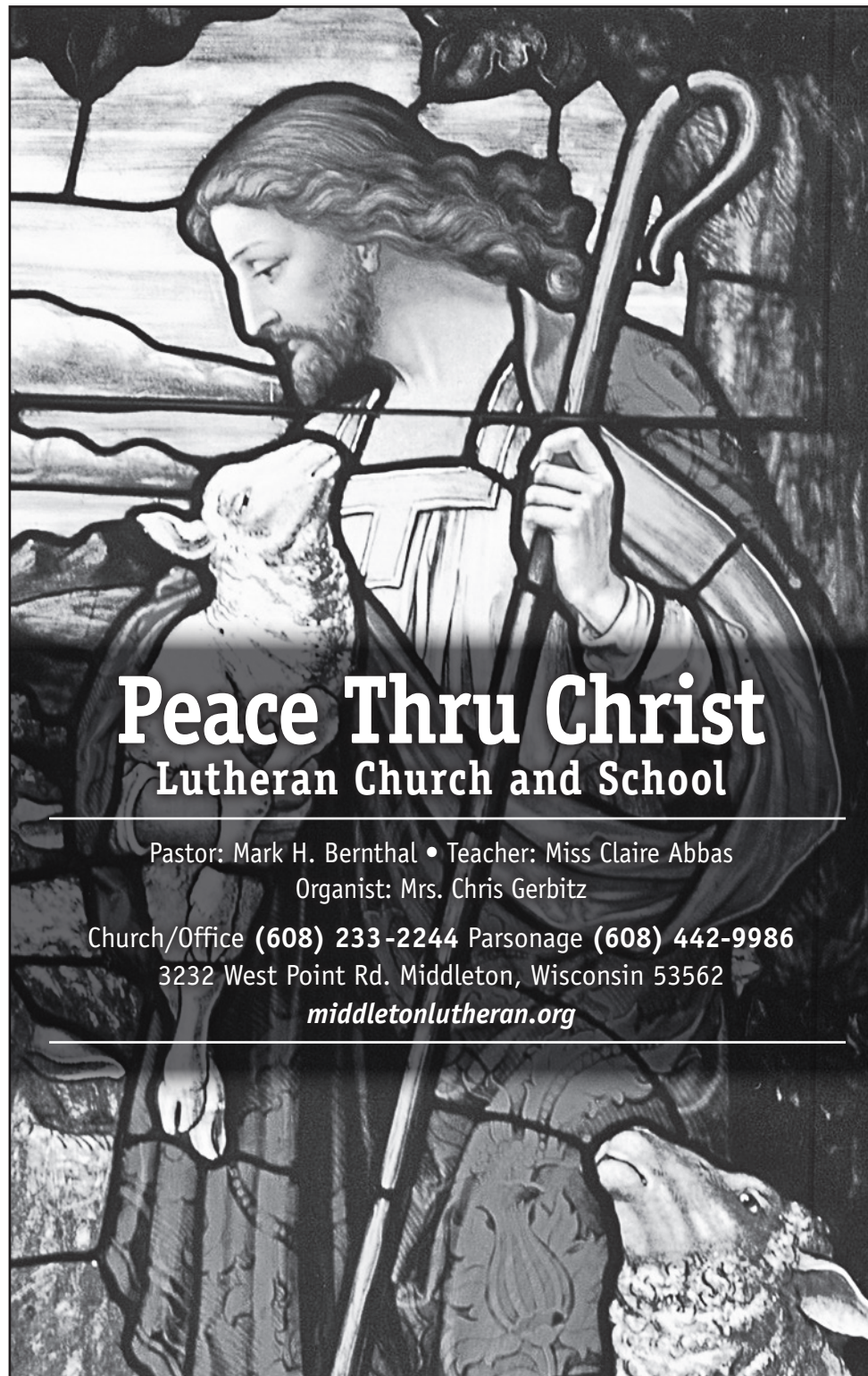

Scripture Readings:

Isaiah 45:1-7 Our Old Testament reading describes how God will bless King Cyrus with victory and wealth. God has chosen this Persian King to bring blessings to His people. During the reign of King Cyrus, Isaiah prophesies that the Jews will be released from captivity and will reestablish their homes and their worship in Jerusalem. Just as God used Cyrus for a good purpose, so God wants to bless His people today through human government.

45 "Thus says the Lord to His anointed, To Cyrus, whose right hand I have held— To subdue nations before him And loose the armor of kings, To open before him the double doors, So that the gates will not be shut: 2 'I will go before you And make the crooked places straight; I will break in pieces the gates of bronze And cut the bars of iron. 3 I will give you the treasures of darkness And hidden riches of secret places, That you may know that I, the Lord, Who call you by your name, Am the God of Israel. 4 For Jacob My servant's sake, And Israel My elect, I have even called you by your name; I have named you, though you have not known Me. 5 I am the Lord, and there is no other; There is no God besides Me. 7 I form the light and create darkness, I make peace and create calamity; I, the Lord, do all these things.'

Philippians 4:4-13 Paul exhorts his readers to "rejoice in the Lord always." Paul urges his Philippian brothers and sisters in Christ to put into practice all that he has taught them. Finally, Paul lets them in on the "secret of being content" in whatever the circumstance.

4 Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice! 5 Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. 6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; 7 and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. 8 Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. 9 The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you. 10 But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care for me has flourished again; though you surely did care, but you lacked opportunity. 11 Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: 12 I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. 13 I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.
