Scripture Readings:

Romans 10:11-17

Paul explains that God offers the riches of salvation to both Jew and Gentile. But that offer is extended only through the preaching of the Gospel and received only by those who believe.

As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." 12 For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, 13 for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." 14 How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? 15 And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" 16 But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?" 17 Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.

Now the Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to The parable of the Great Banquet teaches us that the Lord has prepared the feast of salvation for all Israel in His Son, Jesus. When many who were first invited (the Jews) rejected this invitation, God made sure His servants reached others (the Gentiles) who would appreciate and accept His gracious Gospel invitation through faith.
